There's a name for this: It's called Virtue Signalling. Or, as someone put it, a 'short term dopamine hit of moral posturing'.

You sign an incoming petition to Ban Plastic Bags, because they are choking fish, don't you know. Then, feeling good about saving the sprats, you go to the supermarket and, as usual, bundle your buys into plastic bags! But you're a Good Person

really, because you signed the petition. So that's all right then.

The weekly (daily the week I am writing!) Terrible Event occurs, but you feel better because after work you joined a candlelit vigil for the slaughtered, or you slapped a hashtag on your twitter account (from the safety of your couch), or you wore a T-shirt to the local shops with the slogan 'Je Suis (wherever the latest atrocity took place)'.

The Strangeloves!

Taramosalata

Go:

2 cloves of Garlic, crushed, or half an onion finely chopped (optional)
250g Fish Roe, red or white
250g Bread Crumbs without the crust, soaked in water and then drained well
8-9 tbs Olive Oil
2-5 tbs Water
3-5 tbs Lemon Juice
80g of Cream Cheese (eg. Philadelphia)

1. Place garlic or onion in a blender with 2 tbs of olive oil. Beat for one minute. Add a little more oil and beat again.

2. Now place the fish roe and bread crumbs into the blender, beat the mixture for about one minute.

3. Finally, add the remaining olive oil, the lemon juice, cheese and water if needed (if the mixture is very stiff).
