

# George Gakis

So was that the best AgiotFest ever? Certainly a vox pop taken towards the end indicated that many folk thought so. But why, when there was no (British) big name artist, and little even in the way of original music?

In the end, it was all about ... Entertainment!

Certainly, that's the opinions of this year's 'big name' George Gakis (in fact he is a MAJOR name in Greece, particularly amongst aficionados of rock). 'The Festival was great!' he declared. 'What really impressed me is the difference in the way in which the audience had fun, which is different to the Greeks' way. Everyone had fun! I couldn't believe that everyone was dancing along to Smoke on the Water, for example. In the end, you have to be an entertainer. And the bands were great, all of them.'

Though the headline band was British-based Pure Genius, the Sidari-based Black Strat Band filled the lion's share of the programme, providing back-up for a number of featured artists (including Gakis) as well as playing covers and their own original pieces. Gakis concluded their set, which also saw performances by Lia Kolita and Zoe Unsworth (surely the next Amy Winehouse, with that haunting jazz voice!).

Though he clearly was in tune with Black Strat and its lead singer/guitarist Nikos Sellas, Gakis generally fronts his own band, The Troublemakers; they opened for the Skorpions in Athens recently. They perform a mix of their own music and hard rock from the 70s and 80s, interpretations of bands such as Aerosmith, White Snake and Led Zepellin. Gakis also presents Elvis tributes and does acoustic work. 'I invite schoolchildren - sometimes 500 at a time - to a theatre, where I talk to them about rock music, and take them through a history of the genre in songs. I try to pass on to them the art and the technology, and teach them rock is not all about drugs.'

It was not the first time Gakis has collaborated with Black Strat. 'They kindly asked me to perform one of the songs on their album,' he said. The team will reunite on Wednesday, 7 September at Aquarius, at the Canal d'Amour in Sidari, and I hope we see plenty more of them at future AgiotFests.

We must also mention this year's AgiotFest openers,

The Splinter Band, who slotted in an appearance amongst a hectic programme of summer gigs; and also the inimitable Paul Fennell, who put in an unannounced guest appearance on harmonica during the Black Strat set ('Great harmonica player!' commented Gakis.)

And what about the song Gakis DIDN"T perform? The song from the Youtube link in The Agiot a couple of months ago: Mi Me Kitas? It turns out it was somewhat of an experiment for Gakis, who is not really into ethnic (Greek) songs. The song has a bit of a history. It began life as a genuine folk song from Epirus, vocals accompanied by the traditional klarino of the region. Then in the 70s it entered the rock repertory through a band called Socrates, whose lead guitarist Yiannis Spathas (from Paxos) transformed the klarino riff for the guitar, using influences of Jimi Hendrix and Eric Clapton, and with the help of Vangelis (Clapton was a great fan of the finished product). More recently the song gained huge success nationally with a band called VIC, but this version just took the basic ethnic song and replaced the traditional backing with rock instruments. Then Gakis came in. 'I did some work on traditional songs from each region of Greece, and chose Mi Me Kitas as the one from Ioannina, as I really liked it. I asked Spathas if I could do a cover version, and pushed the song into my own style. The only condition was that Spathas play the intro!'



August was even more full-on and frantic than the previous months, lending substance to the phrase 'time flies when you are having fun'.




'Kostas on his 27th'





# Hilary's Ramblings

IT STRIKES ME EVERY YEAR that renewal does not occur in Spring, but in Autumn. What surprised the experts is not only how efficiently the eagle spots his trainer from that altitude, but how smooth its flight is with no camera shake whatsoever, even when it goes into a power dive.

# Aunty Lula's Love-bites

### Caramel-Almond Torte

### **Ingredients**

6 egg yolks
1+half cup of sugar
Half cup apple cider or juice
1 teaspoon baking powder
1 teaspoon vanilla
Half teaspoon ground cinnamon
6 egg whites
2 cups digestive biscuit crumbs
1 cup ground almonds
1 recipe Caramel Cream Filling
1 recipe Sweetened Whipped Cream

### GO:

- 1. Generously grease and flour three 20cm round baking tins; set aside. In a medium mixing bowl combine egg yolks, 1 cup of the sugar, the apple cider or juice, baking powder, vanilla and cinnamon. Beat with an electric mixer on medium speed about 3 minutes or until thickened and light.
- 2. Thoroughly wash the beaters. In an extra-large mixing bowl beat egg whites on medium speed until soft peaks form [tips curl]. Gradually add the remaining sugar, beating on high speed until stiff peaks form [tips stand straight].
- 3. Fold the egg yolk mixture into the egg white mixture. Fold biscuit crumbs and almonds into egg mixture, a quarter at a time. Divide batter evenly among the prepared tins.

- 4. Bake in a 160 C deg. Oven for 25 to 30 minutes or until top springs back when lightly touched near the centre. Cool on wire racks for 10 minutes. Loosen sides; remove cake layers from tins. Cool thoroughly on wire racks.
- 5. Place a cake layer on a cake plate; spread with half of the caramel cream filling. Top with second layer; spread with the remaining filling. Top with third layer. Frost the top and sides with the sweetened whipped cream. Drizzle with the remaining caramel sauce.

#### **CARAMEL CREAM FILLING**

In a bowl beat one 200 gram packet cream cheese until fluffy. Gradually beat in a quarter cup of caramel syrup.

#### SWEETENED WHIPPED CREAM

1 Cup whipped cream
1 to 2 tablespoons sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla [OPTIONAL]
In a small chilled mixing bowl combine whipped cream, sugar, and vanilla.
Beat with chilled beaters of an electric mixer on medium speed until soft peaks form. Do not over-beat.

### **HOT TIP**

If you prefer your layers to be soggier then coat them with orange juice prior filling.
